## Summer bridge program gets minorities prepped for college

### YOUNGSTOWN

Dajeauna Adams, a Liberty High School graduate, was nervous about starting college next month at Youngstown State University – until this week.

Adams, who will major in criminal justice, is one of 34 incoming minority YSU freshmen enrolled in Summer Bridge. It's a weeklong program to prepare minority and multicultural students for some of the experiences they'll encounter in college.

"I was nervous, but I'm not anymore," Adams said, referring to the program.

YSU's Summer Bridge stretches back to the 1980s.

"It's been shown that minority students have the most difficulty navigating their way through college," said Michael Beverly, the program coordinator.

They may be the first in their families to attend college, so no one at home can help. Financial issues may throw up hurdles, too.

"We're trying to give them a head start," Beverly said.

YSU's graduation rate for minorities is about 18 percent. For those who participated in Summer Bridge, that number increases to 34 percent, according to information from the university's Center for Student Progress.

Students arrived on campus Sunday night and stayed in campus housing through today. Today is the last day.

Sessions cover note taking, time management, conflict resolution and study skills. The week includes a campus tour, and students learn about campus resources available to help them.

When school starts, so does Beyond Bridge. It's a program where Beverly and a graduate assistant meet with the students individually throughout the school year to continue the guidance.

Guy Burney, coordinator of the city's Community Initiative to Reduce Violence, met the students Thursday, offering a presentation on resiliency – bouncing back when things don't go as planned.

He urged them to let go of things that have been holding them back: relationships, habits and unforgiveness.

"There are things in our lives that we must let go of to move on and get better," Burney said.

He also urged them to ask for help when they need it.

Becky Varian, director of the Center for Student Progress, said information about Summer Bridge is sent to incoming minority freshmen. They must fill out an application and center staff interview them.

Varian said the interview enables staff to determine if prospective attendees signed up because they wanted to or because it was urged by a parent.

"We rarely turn anybody away," she said.

Brandon Crawford of Cleveland pointed to the program's session on fixed mindset versus long-range mindset.

A fixed mindset can hold you back, he said.

It resonated with him because he struggled in high school and considered dropping out.

"I didn't think I'd ever go to college," he said.

Crawford shifted from a fixed to a growth mindset after hearing motivational speaker Eric Thomas.

"It was life-changing," he said.

For Micah Watts of Pittsburgh, what he's learning in Summer Bridge is allaying some of his concerns.

He's still nervous about starting college, but it's the good kind of nervous.

"It's like in sports before a game," Watts said. "You're nervous, but you're nervous because you want to do well."

## NASAD's Visitor's Report YSU Department of Art

The NASAD visitor's report indicated that the YSU Department of Art was in compliance with most NASAD standards. However, listed in Section P: Standards Summary of the report, the department appears to be non-compliant with the below standards. The NASAD Commission will require that YSU address these issues, which can result in the Commission deferring reaccreditation until YSU is in compliance with all necessary standards. The department will be required to provide ongoing Progress Reports to NASAD on resolution of these standards. Please note that the department will submit an Optional Response Document to provide additional information directly addressing the visitor's concerns.

Size and Scope: There does not appear to be an appropriate number of faculty to cover the size and scope of the art history or graphic design programs (NASAD *Handbook 2015-16*, II.B.1.a.).

Facilities, Equipment, Health, and Safety: It appears that facilities in Graphic and Interactive Design may not be adequate to support faculty needs, all curricular offerings, and all students enrolled in them, nor do they appear appropriately specialized for advanced work. Further, it does not appear that the number of studio and classroom spaces and the amount and availability of equipment is adequate to serve the scope of the program and the number of students enrolled (NASAD *Handbook 2015-16*, II.F.1.a.).

Facilities, Equipment, Health, and Safety: It appears that the Ceramics, Photography, and Printmaking labs do not have proper ventilation (NASAD *Handbook 2015-16*, II.F.1.g. and i.).

Faculty and Staff: It appears that there is a need for an appropriately trained and OSHA knowledgeable technical support staff person or persons for the sculpture, ceramics, and photography studios in order to provide oversight and safety monitoring and to maintain equipment and provide safe working conditions (NASAD *Handbook 2015-16*, II.E.9.a.).

Library and Learning Resources: It appears that library resources are insufficient to support the size and scope of the departments offerings (NASAD *Handbook 2015-16*, II.G.1.a.)

## ACADEMIC PROGRAMS UPDATE SEPTEMBER 2016

## 1. Undergraduate Program Development:

## <u>Undergraduate Program Actions Requiring Board of Trustees Action and/or</u> Notification or Approval by the Ohio Department of Higher Education


Since the last set of YSU Board of Trustees meetings, the Ohio Department of Higher Education has approved the following undergraduate program changes:

- An online version of the Bachelor of Science in Applied Science (BSAS) in Criminal
  Justice has been approved for immediate implementation including partnership locations at
  Lorain County Community College and Lakeland Community College. In the official
  notification letter, the ODHE expressed appreciation to "all of the developers of the request,"
  stating that the request was "especially informative and thorough in its approach."
- The proposal for a **Bachelor of Engineering in Manufacturing Engineering** program has been posted by the Ohio Department of Higher Education for public comment. The ODHE reviewer described YSU's proposal as "an excellent proposal."

## 2. Graduate Program Development:


A new proposal (Program Development Plan or PDP) for graduate programs must be approved internally by YSU's Graduate Curriculum Committee and Graduate Council before it is presented to the Board of Trustees Academic Quality and Student Success Committee as an information item. The PDP is then forwarded to the Chancellor's Council on Graduate Studies (CCGS) for comment, and a full program proposal is prepared, in response if there are no serious objections. The full proposal must be reviewed by the internal curriculum process and then go to the Board of Trustees for action and approval. The proposal then goes to CCGS for a second review and in-person presentation. If CCGS recommends the program for approval—and after YSU Board of Trustees approval—it goes to the Chancellor's staff, which makes a recommendation to the Chancellor based on CCGS review and public comments. The Chancellor's signature is the final step of the approval process. Board of Trustees approval is required prior to any final decision by the Chancellor's office.

- The full proposal for a Master of Science in Nursing Option for Adult Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner program is being prepared by the department.
- The Master of Athletic Training program was approved by the Higher Learning Commission.




Recent scholarly work and accomplishments of Youngstown State University faculty:

Seven faculty members in Dental Hygiene authored chapters in a new comprehensive dental hygiene textbook, titled *Dental Hygiene: Applications to Clinical Practice* and published by F.A. Davis. Chapter titles and the faculty authors are: "Exposure and Infection Control" by **Maureen Vendemia**, professor emeritus, Dental Hygiene, and **Suzanne Smith**, assistant professor, director and clinic coordinator; "Hard Tissue Examination" by **Diane Kandray**, professor, Dental Hygiene; "Biofilm, Calculus and Stain," by **Silvia Stefan**, assistant professor and director, Allied Health; "Dentifrices and Mouth Rinses" by **Jennifer Pieren**, parttime faculty; and "Esthetics" by **Ruth Palich**, assistant professor and clinic coordinator, and **Mechee Thomas**, part-time faculty.



Corey Andrews, professor, English, and director, Literature Program, authored a textbook titled *The Genius of Scotland: The Cultural Production of Robert Burns, 1785-1834*. The text is intended for an academic audience but also appeals to general readers interested in Robert Burns, Scotland, and/or British history. Andrews gave a



presentation based on the book at the James Hogg Society Conference at the University of Toronto.

**Christopher Barzak**, associate professor, English, was presented a Stonewall Book Awards – Mike Morgan & Larry Romans Children's & Young Adult Literature Award for his third novel, *Wonders of the Invisible World*. Stonewall Book Awards are given annually to works of exceptional merit for children and teens relating to the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender experience.

Brett Conner, associate professor, Mechanical and Industrial Engineering, and director, Advanced Manufacturing Workforce Initiatives, was a speaker and panel discussion participant at a seminar, titled "What Every Business Must Know Today about 3D Printing," in Cleveland. Rodrigo Enriquez Gutierrez, a YSU graduate student and factory engineer at America Makes, also participated.

**Michael Crescimanno**, professor, and **Jim Andrews**, professor, Physics & Astronomy, co-authored a paper, titled "Experimental Realization of Coherent Perfect Polarization Rotation," that was published in *Optics Letters*, a peer-reviewed journal of the Optical Society of America. The work was funded through an NSF EAGER grant.



**Rebecca Curnalia**, associate professor, Communication, and **Mollie Hartup**, assistant director, University Events, were among the top three recognized with MVP Awards at the Mahoning Valley Young Professionals' 25 Under 35 event in February. The awards program honors the region's best and brightest young professionals; a total of six YSU faculty and staff were named Mahoning Valley 25 Under 35 Honorees for 2016.

**Donna M. DeBlasio**, professor, History and Applied History, and director, Center for Applied History, and **Martha I. Pallante**, professor and chair, History, co-authored a book, *Italian Americans of the Greater Mahoning Valley*. The book explores the immigration experience of Italian Americans, their community, workplace dynamics, celebrations, worship and heritage.

Helen Han-Haas, associate professor, Management, coauthored two papers that were accepted for publication.
