Summer Bridge Program Update 2015



The Center for Student Progress Summer Bridge program continues to be one of the most effective student success interventions sponsored by the University. In 2012, our Summer Bridge program was deemed by the U.S. Department of Education as a "promising strategy" for student success. We were among 56 universities and colleges nationwide, and the only from Ohio, included on the list of promising and practical strategies, practices, programs, and activities that have improved rates of post-secondary success, transfer, and graduation. Students who are recruited into the program graduate at almost double the graduation rate of YSU minority students that do not attend.



Recent Changes to the Summer Bridge Program

- Guy Burney, Coordinator of the Youngstown Community Initiative to Reduce Violence (CIRV) conducted resiliency training for the 2014 & 2015 Summer Bridge Cohorts.
- Mark Jones, former Bridge student and YSU graduate student, conducted conflict management training to the Summer Bridge 2015 Cohort.
- High Schools with a high percentage of minorities were identified and a letter was sent to their school counselors sharing "Success Facts" (see below) about the Summer Bridge. The goal was to increase Summer Bridge participation. We had a 25% increase from 2014 – 2015.

Attached is the FY15 Fourth Quarter Report from the Office of Grants and Sponsored Programs for presentation to the Academic Quality and Student Success Committee of the Board of Trustees.

4th Quarter Submissions: (35 submissions requesting \$7,442,620)

During the fourth quarter only, compared to last year, there was a 118% increase in the number of total submissions and a tremendous increase (648%) in the total dollars requested. In comparing results, after the fourth quarter, for the year-to-date (YTD) totals, there was an **11% increase** in number of submissions and **34% increase** in dollars requested for proposed grants and contracts.

Noteworthy submissions included:

Dr. Susan Clutter (Criminal Justice and Forensic Sciences) applied to the U. S. Dept. Justice for a research project involving the Use of Liquid Latex in Fire Investigations (\$331,929)

Dr. Pat Durrell (Physics and Astronomy) applied to the NASA CAN initiative for a five-year educational project entitled "CosmoQuest: Engaging Students and the Public through a Virtual Research Facility" (\$782,150)

4th Quarter Awards: \$1,376,612 (22 funded grants and contracts)

Noteworthy awards included:

Dr. Guha Manogharan (Mechanical and Industrial Engineering) – received a grant award of \$495,610 from the U.S. Dept. Commerce through NIST (National Institute of Standards and Technology) for a Consortium project on Advanced Hybrid Manufacturing.

Dr. Jane Beese (Educational Foundations, Research, Technology and Leadership) – received a grant award of \$274,239 from the Ohio Department of Education for the project "Youngstown City School District Leadership Academy".

Awards: Year-To-Date (YTD)

Compared to this period last year, there was a **27% increase** in dollars awarded and a **144% increase** in number of awards (22 compared to 9). The funded grants and contracts totaled **\$4,557,468**.

In spite of the decrease in funded awards, the significant increases in grant submission activity provide reason to remain optimistic for expected growth in the next quarter.

Update on Assessment of Student Learning

YSU has made and continues to make progress in fostering meaningful and relevant assessment of student learning, including assessment of the General Education program:

• General Education: Progress continues on the two initiatives begun in 2011 to assess the general education program: the ROAD project initiative and the domain assessment initiative.

In Fall 2015, General Education will begin two new assessment projects: 1) Performance-Project General Education Assessment and 2) General Education Course Review. The Performance-Project Assessment will use "messy assignments" to holistically assess general education goals at the capstone level. A pilot of this assessment program will take place during the 2015-16academic year. In addition, General Education has begun investigating the use of course portfolios to periodically review courses in General Education domains. Criteria and sample portfolios are to be developed during the 2015-16 academic year.

• Writing Curriculum Maps: Assessment and General Education have partnered to use existing assessment reporting structures to gather curriculum data on writing outcomes in conjunction with program assessment reports. Undergraduate academic programs were trained in submitting Writing Curriculum Maps, a conceptual curricular mapping tool that outlines the expectations for the development of writing skills for required courses in academic majors. A total of 61 (66%) of all undergraduate programs have submitted writing curriculum maps to date.

This intersection between general education writing and academic program learning outcomes is an area of focus in the HLC Criteria for Accreditation. The aim is to better articulate variations in writing development that are inherent and appropriate to various disciplines, to foster discussions among faculty about curricular expectations around writing communication, and to promote dialogue at the campus level about how to use best practices to improve writing development and achievement. Results from these maps will be used in support of the general education assessment plan and in a fall 2015 writing symposium.

Critical Thinking Curriculum Maps: Assessment and General Education have partnered
to use existing assessment reporting structures to gather curriculum data on critical thinking
outcomes in conjunction with program assessment reports. Undergraduate academic
programs were trained in submitting Critical Thinking Curriculum Maps, a conceptual
curricular mapping tool that outlines the exceptions for the development of critical thinking
skills for required courses in academic majors.

This intersection between general education critical thinking and academic program learning outcomes is another area of focus in the HLC Criteria for Accreditation. Undergraduate programs will be asked to develop critical thinking curriculum maps for the spring of 2016

• **Program Assessment:** The Office of Assessment has been participating in the development of academic program review guidelines in support of HLC expectations regarding regular program review for program evaluation and continuous improvement. Student learning outcomes assessment is an integral component of program review. YSU's HLC Academy mentor and best practices advise inclusion of a complete assessment cycle evaluation as part of program review. Programs have the opportunity to evaluate learning in the entire program, identify strengths and challenges, evaluate curricular improvements, and plan for an assessment focus in the next cycle. The inclusion assessment will foster "closing of the loop" in using and evaluating data for program improvements in student learning. Program review is scheduled to begin in fall semester 2015.

The 2015-16 reporting cycle began in July. All co-curricular units were asked to develop a comprehensive set of student learning outcomes for their unit. In addition, curriculum maps were submitted. Curriculum maps provide a holistic overview of the intersections between the learning goals of the unit and the learning opportunities provided through programs and services. Workshops and consultations assisted programs in translating unit goals into learning outcomes and developing curriculum maps. Programs will use these documents to develop a stable assessment cycle so that all learning outcomes can be evaluated and data can be used to improve the learning environment. Submission rates for the co-curricular units are at 78%, with the remaining units actively working with the department to submit final documents.

This fall, academic programs will submit an abbreviated report focused on the essential areas of student learning data analysis and its use for learning improvements in the 2014-15 academic year. Reports will be due in October 2015. The Office of Assessment will also be educating programs about organization of student learning assessment records and evidence in initial preparation for the 2017-18 Higher Learning Commission reaccreditation visit.

• Activities to Promote a Positive Assessment Culture: A critical part of meeting HLC accreditation expectations is fostering a vital campus community with faculty and staff engaged in meaningful student learning assessment activities. The Office of Assessment meets this expectation in part through programming provided to the campus community. In addition to fulfilling HLC expectations, these activities meet the goals of the 2020 Strategic Plan Cornerstones in the areas of Accountability, Student Success, and Urban Research.

A critical part of building a positive culture is professional development to build capacity in assessment and increase the knowledge and skills of faculty and staff. In June 2015, the Office of Assessment funded an eight-member team of staff and graduate students who work in Student Success, Student Experience, Diversity, and Enrollment Management to attend a one-day assessment and research conference at Ohio State University. This conference provides opportunity to integrate best practices in student learning outcomes assessment, foster an evidence-based approach to practice, and increase professional connections across campus and with other regional institutions. The team reconvened after the trip to identify ways to implement program improvements on campus.

In addition, Assessment is working to support professional development with faculty. The director conducted an hour-long workshop on backwards course design at new faculty orientation by invitation of the Faculty Development Coordinator. Backwards design facilitates alignment of desired student learning with assessment methods and instructional strategies. In addition, faculty learning communities on the scholarship of engagement and the scholarship of teaching and learning are being co-sponsored this year by the Office of Assessment and Faculty Development.

• National Survey of Student Engagement: The National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) will be fielded in the 2015-16 year in support of participation in the Voluntary System of Accountability, a national project to promote transparency in higher education. The NSSE collects data on student experiences in the areas of academic challenge, learning with peers, experiences with faculty, the campus environment, and high impact experiences such as research or internships. The survey results will provide information and benchmarking data regarding student engagement and success activities on the YSU campus. YSU was recently featured by NSSE in a publication outlining best practices in data dissemination and use for program improvements.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS UPDATE SEPTEMBER 2015

1. Undergraduate Program Development:

<u>Undergraduate Program Actions Requiring Board of Trustees Action and/or Notification or Approval by the Ohio Department of Higher Education</u>

Since the last set of YSU Board of Trustees meetings, the Ohio Department of Higher Education (formerly the Ohio Board of Regents) has approved the following undergraduate program changes:

- YSU has received approval to offer a new undergraduate degree program: the Bachelor of Science in Biochemistry.
- The Bachelor of Science degree in Dental Hygiene has been renamed the Bachelor of Science in Dental Hygiene (BSDH).
- Two concentrations within the Bachelor of Arts in English degree (Literary Studies and English Studies) will be deactivated when current students have completed their programs. The B.A. in English will then be the only concentration offered by the department.
- The Bachelor of Science in Business Administration: Management Information Systems is now the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration: Information and Supply Chain Management.

2. Graduate Program Development:

A new proposal (Program Development Plan or PDP) for graduate programs must be approved internally by YSU's Graduate Curriculum Committee and Graduate Council before it is presented to the Board of Trustees Academic Quality and Student Success Committee as an information item. The PDP is then forwarded to the Chancellor's Council on Graduate Studies (CCGS) for comment, and a full program proposal is prepared, in response if there are no serious objections. The full proposal must be reviewed by the internal curriculum process and then go to the Board of Trustees for action and approval. The proposal then goes to CCGS for a second review and in-person presentation. If CCGS recommends the program for approval—and after YSU Board of Trustees approval—it goes to the Chancellor's staff, which makes a recommendation to the Chancellor based on CCGS review and public comments. The Chancellor's signature is the final step of the approval process. Board of Trustees approval is required prior to any final decision by the Chancellor's office.

- The Ohio Department of Higher Education name of the Regents Advisory Committee on Graduate Study (RACGS) has been changed to Chancellor's Council on Graduate Studies (CCGS).
- A PDP for a **Master of Athletic Training** completed the six-week review period for CCGS. The full proposal is being composed.
- The **Master of Accountancy** full proposal has completed the campus curriculum review process and will be sent to CCGS for review. A resolution in support of this program will be presented to the Board of Trustees.

Marketing/Support

Program marketing includes outreach by email, local press, magazines, list serves, and social media. Updates are made to drive applicant and student enrollments for all terms. Continued use of Google ad words and Facebook campaigns have continued to add to our prospect and application pool. In 2015-2016 we have increased the marketing spends= to include more online program specific marketing to drive program enrollments up.

Our Student Support Position has been with us for a full year and has worked to make an impact on enrollment in that time. This person is having an immediate impact on our ability to respond and market to prospects and students. This is their primary role in the office.

Applicant/Prospect/Enrollment Information

We have had increase in our monthly prospects since last year. Avg. monthly prospects in 13'-14' were 97. Avg. monthly prospects in 14' - 15' have been 120.

We have had a 36.9% increase in our monthly applications since last year. Avg. monthly applicants in 13-14' were 10.25 and Avg. monthly applicants in 14-15' are 27.75.

Enrollment for the Fall 2015 is currently 215 in 100% online programs, which is 45 over our 100% online programs spring registration totals. We anticipate an additional 10 enrollments before the term start on 8-19-15.

Faculty developing courses from scratch qualify for a development stipend under the Faculty CBA when approved by the Provost. Here is the current breakdown of this faculty opportunity:

We currently have 51 courses approved through our internal peer review process. There are 94 additional courses in the queue for peer review. The review process consists of a 3 person team reviewing each course against 16 quality-focused criteria.

New in the Fall of 2015 the Distance Education Office is opening a Electronic Information Technology Lab to assist faculty via phone, email, one-on-one instruction. The lab will be staffed with 2 student supervisors and 5-8 student workers. The goal of this lab is to assist faculty in making all of their electronic course content accessible in order to meet accessibility standards set forth in YSU's OCR resolution agreement. A self-paced online course was also developed and is available for faculty to access to learn how to make their documents accessible if they would prefer to learn these steps remotely.
