

What are the myMeals Plan Components

NEW YSU Dining!

There are many great places to eat on the YSU campus. To help you enjoy the variety, value and great food quality, YSU offers Meal Plan Swipes, Pete's Points and NEW Flex Dollars.

Meal Plan Swipes offer the best value and are intended to be used at the Christman Dining Commons for lunch and dinner as well as at the Innovation Kitchen Ohio at Pete's Place for weekday breakfast. For greater flexibility, these swipes can also be "traded" for a meal at any of the YSU Dining by Chartwells operated eateries. The plan you purchase will be recorded on your YSU ID card. It will track your usage of the program and serve as a form of payment. No need to carry cash!

To help you decide which myMeals plan is best for your lifestyle, use our myMeals Assistant located on the dining web site at dineoncampus. com/ysu. The myMeals Assistant will ask

you a few simple questions about your eating habits and lifestyle and will identify the perfect plan for you. Whether you eat three meals a day, or just lunch, dinner, and a between-class snack—our myMeals plans are designed to fit your eating habits. See the charts below for the many myMeals plan options.

Pete's Points are a debit style account of extra money in addition to your meal plan. Pete's Points can be used at any time of day at any dining location on campus and at select locations off campus—with no limits on how much you can spend each day, as long as you do not exceed your balance. Unused Pete's Points will expire at the end of each semester.

Flex Dollars are NEW this year and are intended to be used at all the YSU Dining by Chartwells operated eateries on campus. Flex Dollars can only be used on food on campus so you can rest assured that you will always be able to eat on campus. Flex Dollars can be ADDED to any meal plan and they come as a feature of our Swipe & Save Plans for Anyone. Flex Dollars WILL carry over from the fall to the spring semester.

Pete's Points or Flex Dollars can be used like cash (\$1.00 in points or flex = \$1.00 in cash) toward food purchases.

Meal Exchange & Cash Equivalency Option

Chartwells has been selected as the NEW dining services provider for YSU. This mission for Chartwells is to provide the best possible quality food and customer service to the entire campus community. Although meal plan swipes are intended to be used at the traditional all you care to eat Christman Dining Commons for lunch and dinner and the Innovation Kitchen Ohio at Pete's Place for weekday breakfast, we understand that

your schedule may not always allow you to eat there.

To provide added flexibility with any of the meal plan options, students have the option of "trading" one of their all you care to eat meal swipes for a value oriented meal deal at any dining venue in Kilcawley Center (except at Jamba Juice, Dunkin' Donuts, Wendy's and the Candy Counter). Each location offers a variety of different meal exchange options. Check our dine on campus web site for a listing of meal exchange options offered at each location.

To provide even greater variety, choice and flexibility and NEW this year, YSU Dining by Chartwells is pleased to introduce a cash equivalency option for any meal plan at the Cushwa Café, Schwebel Cafe featuring Youngstown State Bagel Company, Maag Café and Corner Café. With the cash equivalency option, students may trade one of their all you care to eat meal swipes for food purchased up to \$4.25 for breakfast (from location opening to 10 am) and \$5.75 for lunch (10 am to location closing) at any of the satellite locations. Should your purchase be greater than the breakfast and lunch values, you can pay the difference using your Flex Dollars, Pete's Points, cash or credit card.

Meal Time Zones

4 Meals A Day

Whatever meal plan you purchase, you can use up to 4 meal "swipes" a day. You can also use up to 2 swipes per Meal Time Zone. What is a Meal Time Zone, you ask? These are four distinct blocks of time when you can "swipe in" for breakfast, lunch, dinner, and late night. Pay attention to the times that you eat so that you do not run out of "swipes" for any given meal time or day. It is important to know that unused meal swipes for the week expire Sunday evening and are forfeited.

myMeals Plans for Residents

If you live in a YSU residence hall (excluding Weller House), your myMeals plan is included in your room and board. During the Housing sign-up process you will have the opportunity to select your meal plan. Also during the first 11 class days of each semester, you may change your plan to any of those listed here. To do so, visit the Card Office in the Kilcawley Center Staff Office, and bring your YSU ID.

Flex Dollars

Flex Dollars is a prepaid account specifically designed to be used solely at YSU Dining by Chartwells operated venues. These include Christman Dining Commons, KC Food Court, The Hub, Innovation Kitchen at Pete's Place, Cushwa Cafe, Corner Cafe, Maag Cafe, and Schwebel Cafe featuring Youngstown State Bagel Company. Flex Dollars are stored on your YSU ID and can be purchased at any time on line at dineoncampus.com/ysu. Just like Pete's Points, \$1.00 of Flex Dollars = \$1.00 cash. Unused Flex Dollars WILL carry over from fall to spring but not from year to year.

Pete's Points

The Pete's Points Plan is a prepaid account allowing you to dine or snack at any of our campus eateries and various offcampus locations. Your YSU ID is your form of payment. Plan does not include meal "swipes." Instead \$1.00 of Pete's Points = \$1.00 cash. You choose how many points you would like to add to the plan (must be a minimum of \$25).

Points can be added at any time and as many times as wanted throughout the semester. Points are added at the Card Office in the Kilcawley Center Staff Offices.

What If I Don't Use All of My Flex **Dollars or Pete's Points?**

Unused Flex Dollars can only be used at YSU Dining by Chartwells locations AND will carry over from fall to spring but not from year to year. Unused Pete's Points will expire at the end of the semester it is purchased.

What If I Run Out of Flex Dollars and Pete's Points?

NEW this year! Additional Flex Dollars can be purchased at any time on line at dineoncampus.com/ysu. You can also You can purchase more Pete's Points with a deposit (cash/check/credit) of \$25 or more in the Card Office in the Kilcawley Center Staff Office Monday -Friday 8:00am - 4:00pm.

Can I Treat My Parents? YSU Dining by Chartwells would like to offer all parents and guardians the opportunity to dine in the Christman Dining Commons for HALF PRICE when dining with their student.

What If I Lose My ID? Can I Get a Temporary Card?

Absolutely! If you lose or misplace your ID, you will need to stop in the Card Office in the Kilcawley Center Staff Office Monday through Friday 8:00am -4:00pm. A photo ID is required.

How Can I Get a New ID?

YSU student IDs can be replaced at the Registrar's Office or the Card Office in Kilcawley Center for a \$25 fee.

What If My ID Does Not Work? Bring your YSU ID to the Card Office in the Kilcawley Center Staff Office, and we will fix it for you.













(Grant Activity from April 1, 2013 - June 30, 2013)

Attached is the FY13 Fourth Quarter Report from the Office of Grants and Sponsored Programs (OGSP) for presentation to the Academic Quality and Student Success Committee of the Board of Trustees.

4th Quarter Submissions: \$5,480,602 (requested in 31 proposals)

During the quarter, compared to last year, there was a slight decrease in requested funds, but a greater number of submitted proposals. Notable submissions included:

- Tim Maher, Metro Credit, separate proposals of \$342,576 and \$82,620, from the Ohio Dept of Rehabilitation and Corrections for the Advanced Job Training prison program.
- Dr. Ron Chordas, \$200,000 request to the U.S. Dept of Commerce, Economic Development Assistance (EDA) program, with the City of Youngstown.
- Dr. Jane Wetzel (Physical Therapy) and Dr. Rachael Pohle-Krauza (Human Ecology) HMHP, research and safety and efficacy in an outpatient dialysis population. (\$76,810).

4th Quarter Awards: \$175,404 (14 funded grants)

Some noteworthy grant awards included:

- Dr. Darlene Unger (Rich Center for Autism) for the Transition Options in Postsecondary Education for Young Adults with Autism, U. S. Dept. Education, \$14,842.
- Dr. Xiangjia "Jack" Min (Biological Sciences), from the Ohio Plant Biotechnology Consortium for plant research, \$10,000.
- Dr. Alan Jacobs, (Geological and Environmental Sciences), from the National Science Foundation (NSF) for Student Travel Support to attend MEDGEO Conference, \$18,000.

Submissions - Year-to-Date (YTD): Total requests = \$20,537,924 (in 101 proposals)

Awards - Year-To-Date (YTD): Total awards = \$3,553,670 (from 68 grants)

These fourth quarter activities demonstrate a significant decrease (in submissions and awards) compared to the same quarter last year. Nonetheless, the funded grant awards totaled \$3,553,670.

Update on Higher Learning Commission Accreditation and Assessment of Student Learning

YSU has made and continues to make progress in fostering meaningful and relevant assessment of student learning, including assessment of the general-education program:

- New HLC Expectations on Assessment, General Education, Program Review, Persistence, and Completion: In July 2013, the Assessment Director and the General Education Coordinator attended a Higher Learning Commission (HLC) workshop titled "Current Expectations for Assessment of Student Learning, General Education, and Students Success." The HLC has reaffirmed the increasing rigor with which it expects institutions to focus on student learning outcomes. At the conference, the HLC outlined a deepened commitment to student learning with expectations surrounding demonstration of high quality academic programs, institutional practices, and support for student persistence and completion. The clear message was that institutions must place student learning at the center of all they do. This focus on increased rigor and responsibility will be shared with the YSU campus community, and action areas will be identified in the coming months through consultation with the Provost's Office and the HLC Institutional Liaison.
- General Education: Progress continues on the two initiatives begun in 2011 to assess the general education program: the ROAD project initiative and the domain assessment initiative.

As part of the Repository of Assessment Documents (ROAD) project, more than 800 writing samples from the second English composition course (ENGL 1551) have now been evaluated. Writing samples from the spring 2011 semester through fall 2012 have been scored and analyzed. The analysis shows a strong correlation between ACT scores and ROAD rubric scores, but a much smaller correlation between grades and ROAD rubric scores. This fact could be the result of the inconsistent weighting of effort and performance in 1551 courses. The results from the evaluations of the writing samples have already prompted some modifications in the composition program. For example, an effort is underway to encourage more consistency in the course's final assignment across all instructors' sections. However, further improvements need to be made.

Progress has also been made on the upper-division portion of the ROAD project. Preliminary results indicate that upper-division students are doing relatively well on the ROAD rubric, but the sample is still too small to make any formal conclusions. The Writing Center Coordinator met with the General Education Committee in the fall 2012 semester to provide feedback on the pilot program and to provide recommendations about how to improve the submission and evaluation process. As a result of that meeting and with the help of the Writing Center Coordinator and English Composition Coordinator, the instructions for ROAD submissions were modified, a ROAD FAQ for upper-division classes was created, and an effort was made to identify potential ROAD liaisons in every department. Currently, about 25% of departments have identified a ROAD liaison. In fall 2012 and spring 2013, sets of writing samples were collected from previously identified upper-division courses. A review of a sampling of the writings is currently underway.

The second initiative involves assessment of the general education knowledge domains. In fall 2012, Dr. Milton Cox, a nationally-recognized expert on learning communities, consulted on campus and ran a workshop to help initiate the development of learning communities for general education assessment. His feedback prompted some modifications to the previous YSU timeline. In particular, Dr. Cox highly recommended only one-year learning community commitments from faculty as opposed to the multi-year commitments that were imagined in the originally proposed timeline. A pilot learning community on the improvement and assessment of general education began in January 2013 and finished in May 2013. Despite difficulties in recruitment for the learning community, all of the participants felt that the learning community was a worthwhile experience.

In addition to the development of learning communities, steps have been taken to include faculty and student perceptions and self-evaluations in the assessment process. Surveys of both faculty and students are being developed. A preliminary version was submitted to a small group of volunteers from various college-level assessment committees. The survey is currently being revised based on their feedback. The faculty survey should be distributed in fall 2013, and the student survey should be distributed in spring 2014.

The transition to the new general education requirements adopted by the Academic Senate has gone smoothly. Departments have revised curriculum sheets to reflect the new requirements, text in the undergraduate bulletin has been revised, and the professional

academic advisors have not reported any significant problems resulting from the transition. There have also been substantial increases in student general education completion rates.

 Program-Assessment Participation: The Office of Assessment has begun the reporting and review cycles for 2013-14 for the academic and co-curricular (formerly "non-academic") units. The 154 academic programs have begun data review and analysis and will submit reports in October 2013.

Co-curricular units reported in June 2013 to the Office of Assessment with 95% of departments submitting reports (21 of 22 departments) and with 85% evaluated to be of high quality (18 of 21 reports). Reports were reviewed by cross-disciplinary teams of faculty and staff serving on the Assessment Council and the Assessment Director. Feedback was returned in August 2013.

Activities to Promote a Positive Assessment Culture: A critical part of meeting HLC
accreditation expectations is fostering a vital campus community with faculty and staff
engaged in meaningful student learning assessment activities. The Office of Assessment
meets this expectation in part through programming provided to the campus community. In
addition to fulfilling HLC expectations, these activities meet the goals of the 2020 Strategic
Plan Cornerstones in the areas of Accountability, Student Success, and Urban Research.

In April 2013, faculty and staff were recognized by campus leaders for involvement in assessment activities at the Annual Assessment Appreciation Event, attended by more than 80 participants. The 2nd Annual Best Practices in Assessment Poster Competition, held at the Appreciation Event, attracted 11 entrants from four colleges and three co-curricular departments, showcasing the positive impact of assessment activities on student success, research, and program improvement.

Awarded in May 2013, the Innovation in Assessment Mini-Grant Competition provided more than \$10,000 to eight projects, representing four colleges and one co-curricular department. Mini-grant projects focus on diverse areas such as minority retention, program development, innovation in instructional design, and research using biosensors.

In addition to innovation programs, a focus on professional development builds capacity in assessment and increases the knowledge and skills of faculty and staff. In June 2013, a 12-member team of Academic Affairs staff, Student Affairs staff, and faculty attended a one-day drive-in assessment and research conference at Ohio State University. Positive impacts of the conference have included increased connections across campus divisions, a fall assessment skill-building curriculum for Student Affairs, and further training scheduled for implementation of a best-practices backwards design curriculum for faculty.

Student Satisfaction Survey: To support participation in the Voluntary System of
Accountability, the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) was administered in
spring 2013. This survey also serves as a metric for the 2011-2020 Strategic Plan, Student
Success Cornerstone, Theme 2. All first-year and senior students were invited through email
invitation and campus-wide promotions to participate. The final response rate was excellent,

with more than 23% of students responding. The survey asks students about high-impact educational practices proven to lead to student learning and student persistence. Data from the survey will be returned in late fall 2013 and will be disseminated to campus constituents in spring 2014 in order to improve educational practices and impact student learning and success.

New Higher Learning Commission Criteria and Accreditation Pathways

The Board of the Higher Learning Commission approved the new criteria for accreditation (with more focus on institutional transparency, institutional performance, student persistence, and program/degree completion) in February 2012.

At the same time, the HLC approved new "pathways" for accreditation. The pathways will replace the traditional accreditation process for most institutions and change the schedule for accreditation. On April 5, 2012, the HLC informed the institution that YSU is eligible to participate in "the Open, AQIP, or Standard Pathway for reaffirmation of accreditation" when the new criteria go into effect in fall 2012.

On July 26, 2012, the HLC notified YSU that it has been approved to select a preferred accreditation pathway. YSU has selected the Open Pathway for reaffirmation of accreditation.

- The Open Pathway operates on 10-year cycle and offers more flexibility, fewer comprehensive evaluations, fewer site visits, and less monitoring than the Standard Pathway. AQIP operates on a seven-year cycle and thus would require more frequent reaffirmation and site visits than the Open pathway.
- YSU will define and begin a project in 2012-13 (selecting a suitable Quality Initiative that focuses on "institution innovation and improvement"). YSU will have several years to complete the proposed project, after which a quality-initiative review will occur. The next reaffirmation of accreditation visit will occur in 2017-18.
- Assurance Review accreditation reports will normally be due in years 4 and 10 of the
 process. Since YSU will transition into the pathway in year 5 (2012-13), YSU will not
 have an assurance review report due at year 4. The assurance review in 2017-18 will
 include the site visit for reaffirmation of accreditation.
- The annual reports, plus the quality initiative, plus the assurance report and visit in 2017-18 will replace the former comprehensive evaluation process. According to the HLC, the assurance report, or "self-study," may be somewhat shorter than the old-style self-studies and will not necessarily involve the entire campus as in the past.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS UPDATE AUGUST 2013

1. Undergraduate Program Development:

<u>Undergraduate Program Actions Requiring Board of Trustees Action and/or OBOR Notification or Approval</u>

The Ohio Board of Regents (OBOR) is continuing to revise its approval processes for undergraduate program proposals. Since the last set of YSU Board of Trustees meetings, OBOR has approved the following undergraduate program changes:

 The former Professional Writing and Editing Program (PWE) is now called the Professional and Technical Writing Program (PTW).

2. Graduate Program Development:

A new proposal (Program Development Plan or PDP) for graduate programs must be approved internally by YSU's Graduate Curriculum Committee and Graduate Council before it is presented to the Board of Trustees Academic and Student Affairs Committee as an information item. The PDP is then forwarded to the Regents Advisory Committee on Graduate Study (RACGS) for comment, and a full program proposal is prepared, in response, if there are no serious objections. The full proposal must be reviewed by the internal curriculum process and then go to the Board of Trustees for action and approval. The proposal then goes to RACGS for a second review and in-person presentation. If RACGS recommends the program for approval—and after YSU Board of Trustees approval—it goes to the Chancellor's staff, which makes a recommendation to the Chancellor based on RACGS review and public comments. The Chancellor's signature is the final step of the approval process. Board of Trustees approval is required prior to any final decision by the Chancellor's office.

- Requests for online delivery for a Master of Business Administration, Master of Respiratory Care, Master of Science in Criminal Justice, and Master of Science in Engineering-Management have undergone campus review and have been approved by RACGS.
- A program development plan (PDP) for a Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) has undergone
 the campus review process. YSU has received comments from RACGS. The Full Proposal
 is now in preparation in the department.
- Discussions to initiate a Master of Science in Actuarial Science in the Department of Mathematics have been tabled. Modifications have been made to accommodate actuarial science students under the current program.
- A PDP for a Master of Engineering Physics has undergone the campus review process.
 YSU has received comments from RACGS. The Full Proposal is now in preparation by the department.
- The Department of Nursing has proposed the Adult Gerontology Acute Care Nurse
 Practitioner Option for its Master of Nursing (MSN) degree. The department has also
 proposed the Adult Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner Post-MSN Certificate.
 These proposals will undergo campus review during fall 2013.
