YOUNGSTOWN STATE UNIVERSITY Budget to Actual Comparison For the 6-month period of 7/1/12-12/31/12

Overall, actual general fund revenues and expenses are below budgeted levels.

- Tuition and mandatory fees as a percentage of the annual budget was 87.8%, lower than expected. This is attributable to a fall semester enrollment drop of 4.3% and a spring semester enrollment drop of 5.0%. The University is taking action to address this revenue shortfall, including efforts to reduce expenses and exploring ways to restore enrollment levels.
- Other tuition and fees include non-resident surcharges, lab and material fees, college fees, graduation fees, and application fees. These fees as a percentage of the budget totaled 83.9% at the end of the second quarter. This is lower than expected, which is also attributable to the drop in fall and spring semester enrollments.
- State appropriations are on target for the second quarter. However, the Ohio Board of Regents will finalize the State Share of Instruction formula calculations in December. This could impact state appropriation levels for the remainder of the year.
- Investment income, consisting of realized net gains and interest income, was 24.5% of
 the annual budget, lower than expected. This is due to the investment portfolio having
 been shifted to equity markets and a yield decline for fixed income investments.
 Management will review internal practices for disbursing interest income for possible
 revision.
- At 76.8% of the annual budget, combined revenues through the second quarter are below budgeted targets. A caution indicator was assigned due to two main factors: (1) the largest category of revenues—tuition and fees—are below target, as described above; and (2) concerns persist over future enrollment levels, the primary driver of revenues.
- At 53.1% of the annual budget, combined expenses and transfers for the second quarter are below budgeted targets. Actual expenses in nearly all major categories were below targeted levels, reflecting the University's efforts to curb spending in light of reduced revenues as described above.
- The largest categories of expenses—wages and benefits—were below targeted levels, largely due to the extraordinary level of vacant staff and faculty positions combined with reductions in health care expenses.

FY 2013 Vacancy Savings Report 2nd Quarter FY 2013 (as of December 31, 2012)

The following quarterly vacancy savings report is provided pursuant to the FY 2013 Operating Budget, adopted by the Board of Trustees on June 13, 2012, which states in part:

"Because the FY 2013 budget relies so heavily on vacancy savings, and because this use of position vacancies represents only temporary budgetary savings, the Administration will report quarterly to the Board of Trustees on the status of funds budgeted as vacancy savings."

Note that the figures provided in this report reflect permanently budgeted staff positions; faculty vacancy savings are not included here.

Youngstown State University Information Technology Master Plan

March 2013 Update

Banner Project - R. Marsico

Commencing in March 2012, an improved method for recording and tracking formal project requests was implemented on behalf of the applications systems group within Computer Services. To date, 186 unique tasks have been created in response to customer requests with user sign-off on 84 of the delivered solutions. Six requests were withdrawn due to pre-existing solutions or changing needs and, as of this writing, 96 projects remain in active or pending status.

Project highlights include the following:

- Work continues on Phase 1 of the automated travel expense reimbursement request form. The automated process will incorporate the recently announced 2013 Travel Guidelines enforcing changes in allowable reimbursement amounts for vehicle expenses, mileage, lodging and meals. Referencing government standards and University travel policies, costs associated with meals, lodging, and transportation will be supplied and/or verified at the time of data entry.
- One-stop FERPA is currently in development. At present, a student must complete a Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act form for the Departments of Student Accounts, Registration, and Financial Aid. The introduction of a one-stop counter will allow the student to complete one form satisfying the requirements of the three areas. Data entered will be captured by the Banner system and used to programmatically populate tables relevant to FERPA processing.
- Enhancements continue to be introduced to the University's electronic-mail environment. An automated nightly process was recently placed into production ensuring that the campus email address is appropriately marked as the preferred address for all current term students, employees, and retirees, thus contributing to the timely delivery of correspondence utilizing the cloud-based O365 solution.
- A new Self Service Banner application was developed allowing a faculty member to select from a list of their current Banner courses those to be delivered through the Blackboard (Bb) virtual learning environment. Once a course is selected, it is loaded into Bb along with a listing of all students who are registered for that course. As students drop and add courses, the process will automatically keep the two systems in sync. With this functionality, Bb participation is literally a click away.

- Acting upon a request submitted by the College of Education, Praxis test score results are now loaded into custom Oracle tables and are available for analysis, in conjunction with Banner student data, using available reporting tools and methods. Praxis tests, which measure basic student skills, are often used to evaluate candidates for entry into teacher education programs.
- Progress continues to be made on the University's Business Intelligence (BI) initiative (also referred to as the data warehouse project). All extracted data relating to the proof of concept (POC) has been defined and mapped back to the Banner source. Data relevant to the POC will be staged in the Banner Operational Data Store (ODS) facilitating data access and analysis.

Media & Academic Computing - M. Hrishenko

During the fourth quarter for calendar year 2012, units within Media & Academic Computing (M&AC) fulfilled over 2,200 requests for technology assistance in addition to support requests resolved upon first contact by the YSU Tech Desk. Complimenting these efforts are achievements on various projects as outlined below:

- Office 365 (cloud-based, secure, anywhere access to email and calendaring) was deployed for all YSU faculty and staff complimenting the deployment that occurred for students just prior to the Fall 2012 Term. Effectively replacing the legacy email/calendaring system, Office 365 deployment provides functionality needed to facilitate upgrades to the YSU portal. Other Office 365 functions, including conferencing and messaging are currently being tested.
- Implementation of the Altiris technology management suite, acquired and deployed during the Fall 2012 Term continued. Altiris provides desktop, applications and asset management automating, in many cases, technology support tasks that previously involved hands-on work on a computer-by-computer basis. The product has been configured to automatically deliver some previously manual software updates and also to cleanse computers to enhance performance. Additionally, the Altiris remote diagnosis/access functionality has been put in use by the Tech Desk and others to resolve issues without the need for an on-site visit.
- The ongoing enterprise domain project achieved a significant milestone with the migration of all remaining administrative areas of the University to the ysu.local domain. This sets the stage for a more consistent and comprehensive management of technology services delivered to the desktop. Services delivered include automated maintenance of the Windows operating system environment as well as individualized and shared storage space on the network. Planning and assessment has begun in preparation for migrating academic departments to the domain starting in February.
- New equipment was purchased by M&AC and installed in the College of Fine & Performing Arts to reduce that complexity and improve the reliability of broadcast transmissions originating at YSU including Homework Express.

- Improvement in services offered by the YSU Tech Desk continue with the following specific initiatives:
 - More comprehensive reporting of customer service statistics including completed and outstanding work orders (requests) and percentage of requests resolved upon first contact
 - Enhanced technology at the service counter to track and fulfill student/faculty/staff requests
 - New computers ordered for the fourth floor lab of Maag Library
 - ❖ Additional documentation especially as related to Office 365 features and functionality along with a live Twitter feed on the Tech Desk website posting updates from Microsoft regarding status of the Office 365 cloud service
 - A self-service web presence instituted campus-wide. This assists those needing technology support and/or requesting assistance from the division of Information Technology Services.
- Research and analysis of the potential role of virtual delivery of desktop applications to the YSU community began and is continuing.

Network Telecommunications & Security - J. Rakers

- Network Telecom made significant progress in completing the distribution phase of the Q2 network project, all campus buildings, except Fedor and Phelps, have equipment installed and are ready for end-users.
- Network Telecom completed the install of fiber optics connecting Wick House, Weller House, and Buechner Hall into Kilcawley House. This provides segmentation for Housing.
- Network Telecom completed the upgrade of the campus PBX systems and supported systems during Winter break.
- Network Security successfully migrated employees to a hosted email encryption and antispam system during Winter break.
- Network Security performed pilot testing of sensitive information scanning on network/desktop systems and is awaiting financial support to deploy this system to critical campus areas.
- Network Security is assisting the Office of Vice President for Finance & Administration in coordinating mandatory PCI training for employees with access to credit card information. The University's PCI compliance is set to expire March 1, 2013, without updated training and completion of the PCI SAO.

Shared Services Update – January 29, 2013

Youngstown State University continues to be an active participant in the Ohio Board of Regents Efficiency Advisory Committee. At these meetings we affirmed all of the good work on state-wide shared services, mostly in the areas of procurement, that have been led by the IUC.

We will continue to direct a lot of the work by the Board of Regents Committee through the IUC. YSU and Kent State University officials met during December to identify areas for potential shared services. We will focus on purchasing and travel to look for ways to create a virtual shared organization since nearly all of the functions of these two processes are online.
