OFFICE OF ALUMNI ENGAGEMENT REPORT

December 2016

SUMMARY

Alumni Engagement's focus on strengthening regional Alumni networks in Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Columbus and New York/New Jersey was followed up with a strategically targeted Alumni Society membership campaign. This acquisition mailing of 11,000 pieces was dropped on October 14. As a cost savings, solicitations to additional target groups will be sent via email. Renewal efforts are ongoing and two new membership benefits were added for FY17.

Pete's Pride has participated in multiple recruitment and outreach events throughout the summer and fall and is presently involved in the letter-writing campaign to admitted students. On September 15, Pete's Pride celebrated over 3,600 hours of cumulative volunteer service with an appreciation reception at the McDonough Museum of Art.

The new YSU Showcase Tailgate Tent has been supported by Alumni Engagement staff and Pete's Pride volunteers, and the Alumni Society will march in the Homecoming Parade and host a Homecoming Tailgate on October 29. The office is currently involved in the planning phases for the 50th Anniversaries of the Planetarium, Department of Nursing, Department of Geography, and YSU's 50th Anniversary as a State University.

The office continuously conducts research to update alumni database contact information and provides the campus community with lists for newsletters, event invitations, assessment efforts and more. The office is presently working with Marketing and Communications in developing a new Alumni Society logo and improvements to its website and Facebook pages. All activities fall in line with one or more of the Alumni Engagement Strategic Plan Cornerstones.

Cornerstone 2: Build and Sustain Alumni Engagement

Alumni Society Membership Solicitations

The significant increases in Alumni Society memberships from FY16 are producing steady renewals in FY17. An acquisition direct mail campaign of 11,000 pieces was dropped on October 14. The strategically targeted mailing was directed to non-members in five target areas, and each target group received a tailored message. Note that year-to-year dollars are not analogous as the FY16 solicitation was mailed in First Quarter, and the FY17 solicitation was mailed in Second Quarter. Additional geographic regions will receive targeted email solicitations.



Regional Network Development

In the first and second quarters of Fiscal Year 2017, the Office of Alumni Engagement continued its focus on developing and strengthening its regional Alumni networks. These efforts have resulted in new network leadership in Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Columbus and the New York/New Jersey area. One of the New York leaders has applied for membership on the YSU Alumni Society Advisory Board.

Enhanced Digital Engagement

Our ongoing focus on digital engagement and social media continues to provide dramatic results, generating 2,990 Facebook followers, up 10% over last year and engaging an average of 2,470 people per week compared to 560 people per week last year. Our re-established presence on Twitter resulted in 419 followers, up 16% over last year.

The office is presently working with Marketing and Communications in developing a new Alumni Society logo and improvements to its website and Facebook pages. Website improvements will feature a more streamlined appearance; a reduction in clutter through the provision of primary menus with dropdown options; and elimination of duplicative listings.

Alumni Research

In the first quarter, the office produced 43 reports for colleges, departments, assessment and alumni representing 501,872 records. The office is working with YSU Information Technology on preparing a preferred email type exclusively for alumni use, and the project is slated for completion in December.

The ongoing *Help us Stay in Touch* campaign –to drive alumni to the website to update their contact information –continues to enhance alumni data integrity by providing user-based address updates. Each College has been encouraged to include a link to the Update Form on all of their online communications. 

Campus News of Note

Fall 2016*



West Campus projects proceed

YSU officials joined representatives from Hallmark Campus Communities, Fortress Real Estate Companies and Barnes & Noble College to break ground on the second phase of the University Edge student apartments and a new campus bookstore on the West Side of campus.

- Phase I of University Edge student apartments, with 162 beds, opened for Fall semester 2016 and is filled to capacity.
- Phase II of University Edge student apartments, with 220 beds, is now under construction and will open for the start of Fall semester 2017.
- The new YSU bookstore, operated by Barnes & Noble College, is now under construction and is expected to open during the 2017-18 academic year.

Wick/Lincoln improvements

Major improvement projects by the city of Youngstown are underway on two main roadways at YSU – Wick and Lincoln avenues – that will transform the worn, bumpy and cluttered streets into new, landscaped and safe pedestrian walks and motorways. The projects include new street surfaces, sidewalks, curbing, lighting, lane configurations and landscaping. In addition, utility lines along Wick Avenue will be placed underground.

Enrollment jumps

Enrollment is up by 285 students or 2.3 percent from last year. YSU has 12,756 students enrolled this Fall semester, up from 12,471 last Fall semester. It is the first Fall-to-Fall enrollment increase since 2010. In addition, the incoming freshmen class has the highest standardized test scores and high school grade point averages in the university's history. "Reversing the trend on enrollment is a major step forward as we continue to focus on increasing excellence across campus," YSU President Jim Tressel said.



CCP numbers increase 30 percent

More than 1,400 Mahoning Valley high school students earned college credit at YSU in the first year of Ohio's College Credit Plus – a 30 percent increase over the College in High School program YSU offered previously. Statewide, more than 52,000 high school students participated in the state-funded CCP in its inaugural year, saving themselves and their families an estimated \$110 million in college tuition.

Barnes & Noble in the house

YSU and Barnes & Noble College have inked an agreement for BNC to manage the university's bookstore. "It is a pleasure to welcome Barnes & Noble College and its decades of expertise and success in the bookselling business to the YSU campus," said Neal McNally, vice president for Operations and Finance.

Bowling rolls into action

YSU's new women's bowling team rolled into action for the first time in October. The university approved the creation of the new bowling program in Spring 2015. It is the 19th sport played at YSU, the 11th women's sport. Coach Chelsea Gilliam comes to YSU after two years as full-time head coach of bowling squads at Union College in Barbourville, KY. She is a 2012 graduate of the University of Pikeville, where she bowled on the 2012 NAIA national championship squad.

Lectures galore

It was a busy fall on the speaking circuit at YSU. Political satirist Kamau Bell, host of CNN's "United Shades of America," presented the Centofanti Symposium Sept. 14, followed by TV journalist Anderson Cooper of CNN with the Skeggs Lecture Sept. 24 and Lori Greiner, one of the stars of "Shark Tank," with the Thomas Colloquium on Oct. 26.

Student Success

Cassandra Shaffer, a senior chemistry major, participated in the Syracuse University International Research Experience for Undergraduates at the Technical University of Graz, Austria. The REU is funded by the National Science Foundation, and Shaffer was one of only eight students selected nationally to travel to Austria.

Antonette M. Scharsu of Hubbard, a senior majoring in Politics and International Relations and Russian language, is the latest YSU student to win the prestigious Gilman International Scholarship to study abroad. Scharsu is studying in St. Petersburg, Russia. She is the 18th YSU student since 2012 to be selected a Gilman scholar. In all, YSU Gilman scholars have received nearly \$60,000 in scholarships and studied in Russia, Thailand, Spain, India, China, Turkey, South Korea, Cyprus, Germany, Dominican Republic and Japan.



Five students in the Musical Theater program traveled to Oslo, Norway, with a select group of other students from throughout the world, to participate in the Musical Theatre Educators' Alliance Conference. The students, pictured at left, are Daniel Navabi, Stefon Funderburke, Mia Colon, Angelique Tanner, and Makenzie Moorman.

Eleven business students, nine from YSU and two from the University of Akron, recently completed full-time paid exporting internships as a part of the Ohio Export Internship Program. The students are Daniel Belinky, Connie Buck, Fabio Bassil, Fadi Chammas, Nichole

DeSantis, Stephanie Wood, Tiffani Pike, Yana Flider and Briana Scott.

YSU's Intercollegiate Moot Court program ranks 11th in the nation, above schools such as Duke University, University of Virginia and University of Chicago. The rankings were compiled by the American Moot Court Association and are based on the average win total of teams over a three-year period.

Mathematics students continued their winning ways at MathFest 2016 in Columbus, earning two awards for excellence. The YSU team has historically been one of the most successful at the annual event. YSU won its first award in 1989 and has won at least one award every year since, except in 1992 and 1994. YSU students won a record number of awards in 2013 with six. The team won five awards in 2005, 2006 and 2015.
