University Police Department Accreditation

The International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administration (IACLEA) developed a set of standards as a part of the IACLEA accreditation program. These standards are viewed as nationally recognized best practices and appropriate criteria for the effective and efficient operations of a campus public safety agency. They represent minimum requirements for a department to achieve accreditation through the IACLEA program.

Campus public safety executives who choose to have their agencies accredited under this program will have thoroughly examined all aspects of their operations. They will have made conscious decisions about policies and procedures that fit the public safety requirements of their campuses and will have implemented those policies and trained their employees in their use. Accreditation does not purport that one agency provides better services to its campus than a non-accredited agency. What it does signify is that the accredited agency was carefully measured against an established set of standards and has met or exceeded accepted practices in campus public safety.

As "The Leading Authority for Campus Public Safety," it is the IACLEA's intent to advance public safety for educational institutions by providing educational resources, advocacy, and professional development services. These standards and the related accreditation process are viewed as one vehicle to accomplish this objective.

Negligent security cases are an emerging area of civil law as crime victims increasingly attempt to hold the premise owners and not the actual perpetrators civilly liable for crimes against them. Whenever a negligent security claim is brought against a university, that university and its campus public safety entity must demonstrate that it has established and adheres to reasonable security standards. Achieving and maintaining accreditation is one method by which campus law enforcement can demonstrate compliance with professionally accepted standards of operation for law enforcement.

There are 5 steps to the IACLEA Accreditation process

- 1. Inquiry and application (04/2014)
- 2. Compliance Development and Review (current process)
- 3. Agency Evaluation (projected 01/2017)
- 4. Commission Review (projected 03/2017)
- 5. Award and Maintenance (04/2017)

There is an expected up front cost of approximately \$10,000.00. The ongoing cost will be the annual fee of \$3,000.00 paid to IACLEA to maintain the accreditation.
