# Introduction of the newly formed Office of University Events with the Division of University Relations

On April 1, 2015, the Office of Alumni and Events became two separate offices within the newly formed Division of University Relations: the Office of Alumni Engagement and the Office of University Events. Jackie LeViseur manages the University Events team which includes Erin DeBernardo, Mollie Hartup and Christina Texter.

The focus of University Events is the creation, coordination and assistance of events on a broader scale. Within that focus, the Office is creating and implementing a standard "University Look" to carry across all events. The mission of University Events is to communicate and visualize YSU's message, motivation and image in the best way possible to internal and external audiences. In doing so, we want to build campus and community spirit and highlight all that the University has to offer.

In regard to events, the Office is charged, as we have in the past, with coordinating and implementing major university events. Annually, these will include commencement, convocations, grad central, the faculty and staff awards banquet, the Canfield Fair, Friend of the University, Youngstown Day and the Skeggs Lecture Series. We will also be assigned unique one-time events such as political and dignitary visits, presidential installations, partnering community, campus, faculty and athletic events.

Collaborating with the Office of Marketing and Communications, we have come up with a University Look that will carry through with all event-related materials, including but not limited to pull-up banners, table clothes and runners, publications and gonfalons. It is our intent with the University Look to uphold the exacting standards of YSU and to ensure all events exhibit the same level of quality that envisions YSU's dedication to tradition and excellence. Our office is acquiring and loaning out event items with the University Look.

A remaining aspect of University Events is assisting campus colleges, departments and programs with their events when requested. Under this realm, University Events is instituting the University Look, as with major university events, and helping with event logistics and day of support when needed and to the capacity required.

During this transitional period, University Events will of course be working with the newly formed Office of Alumni Engagement to advise and assist with alumni events and programs throughout the remainder of the calendar year, or as long as needed, to ensure the smooth transition and continuation of the alumni efforts. The entire Division of University Relations is working together to promote YSU's mission.

# WYSU-FM SPRING 2015 MEMBERSHIP DRIVE REPORT

WYSU-FM raised \$132,617 in pledges from 1081 donors (including 80 new members) during its April 2015 campaign. It was the station's most successful spring drive by over \$18,000. It was also unique in that for the first time ever, members were reached through mail, email, the website, social media, and short air spots over four weeks without interrupting programs. The entire traditional fund drive was eliminated.

Listener support came from 12 states across the entire WYSU listening area, which includes people who access our streaming services. Corporate and foundation support for the drive was provided by The Pollack Personal Foundation, The Francis and Lillian Schermer Charitable Trusts, The Warren P. Williamson, Jr. Fund, and The Youngstown Foundation.
