BACKGROUND: The Board of Trustees has requested an annual report of graduation rates.

SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS:

- 2014 Four-Year Cohort for Student-Athletes (page 1 and 2):
 1. Student-athletes graduate at a 31% greater rate than the general YSU students. Therefore, Athletics is contributing in the retention and graduation goals of YSU at a rate that is significantly greater than MVFC and HL averages.
 2. Our student-athlete rate of 65% is right at the MVFC and HL averages, which one must consider the number of private schools included in those averages.
 3. The 65% graduation rate is the highest graduation rate on record.

- 2014 Four-Year Cohort for General Students (page 3):
 1. YSU's 34% rate for the general student population falls well below HL and MVFC averages.

- 2014 Graduation Rate for Those Exhausting Eligibility (page 4):
 1. We continue to excel in graduating those students who exhaust eligibility and follow through to graduation thanks in part to our fifth year aid program that provides tuition scholarships.

- 2014 Graduation Success Rate (page 5):
 1. 76 represents YSU's highest rate since the GSR was created in 2005.


BACKGROUND: The Board of Trustees has requested an annual report of our programs Academic Progress Rate (APR).

SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS:

- The minimum APR score permitted by the NCAA is 930.
- Women's Tennis, who previously fell below the 930 mark, has now exceeded the minimum.
- Men's Indoor and Outdoor Track have fallen below the 930 mark. We have implemented Academic Improvement Plans for each sport and the plan has shown progress after the first year of implementation.
- The issue with the track programs was a result of a previous philosophy to not require ineligible SA's to attend summer school to regain eligibility since their sport doesn't compete until spring semester. However, such practice was losing APR points and is ceasing, effective in the summer of 2014.
- Page 2, 3 and 4 of tab 2 are historical APR rates.


BACKGROUND: The Board of Trustees has requested an annual report of our student-athletes grade point averages.

- Our student-athletes recently concluded the Spring 2014 semester with the highest overall cumulative GPA in history with a 3.17.
- 15 varsity teams had a *cumulative* team GPA over 3.00, which is an all-time high.
- 61% (201) of our SA's had a *semester* GPA of 3.00 or greater during the Spring 2014 semester, which is an all-time high.


