BACKGROUND: The Board of Trustees has requested an annual report of graduation rates.

SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS:

- 2013 Four-Year Cohort for student-athletes (page 1):
 1. Student-athletes graduate at a 27% greater rate than the general YSU students so we're doing our part in the retention and graduation goals of YSU and which is significantly greater than MVFC and HL averages.
 2. Our student-athlete rate of 62% is slightly below the MVFC and HL averages, which one must consider the number of private schools included so we fair pretty well.
 3. Our 2013 62% rate ties 2005 as the highest graduation rate during the past decade.


- 2013 Four-Year Cohort for General Students (page 2):
 1. YSU's 35% rate falls well below HL and MVFC schools.

- 2013 Graduation Rate for Those Exhausting Eligibility (page 3):
 1. We continue to excel in graduating those students who exhaust eligibility and follow through to graduation thanks to our fifth year aid program that provides tuition.

- 2013 Graduation Success Rate (page 4):
 1. 74 represents YSU's highest rate since the GSR was created in 2005.


BACKGROUND: The Board of Trustees has requested an annual report of our programs Academic Progress Rate (APR).

SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS:

- Football and Men's Basketball, who previously were below the 930 mark, have now exceeded the minimum.
- Men's Indoor and Outdoor Track, and Women's Tennis have fallen below the 930 mark. We have implemented Academic Improvement Plans for each sport and believe women's tennis will be remedied this upcoming year and Men's track may take two years.
- Women's Indoor and Outdoor Track are approaching the 930 mark and could become an issue next year. We are working to minimize the decline but the most recent year (914) will stay with their APR for four years so it will weigh down their number for that time.
- The issue with the track programs was a previous philosophy to not require ineligible SA's to attend summer school to regain eligibility since their sport doesn't compete until spring semester. However, such practice was losing APR points and is ceasing, effective this summer 2014.
- Page 2 and 3 of Tab 2 are historical APR rates.


BACKGROUND: The Board of Trustees has requested an annual report of our student-athletes grade point averages.


