BACKGROUND: The Board of Trustees has requested an annual report of graduation rates.

SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS:

- 2015 Four-Year Cohort for student-athletes (page 1 and 2):
 1. Student-athletes graduate at a 30% greater rate than the general YSU students. Student-athletes at Youngstown State are contributing in the retention and graduation goals of their institution at a rate that is significantly greater than MVFC and HL averages.
 2. Our student-athlete rate of 64% is just below the MVFC and HL averages, which one must consider the number of private schools included in those averages.
 3. The 64% graduation rate is the second highest graduation rate on record (behind last year's rate of 65%).


- 2015 Four-Year Cohort for General Students (page 3):
 1. YSU's 34% rate for the general student population falls well below HL and MVFC averages.

- 2015 Graduation Rate for Those Exhausting Eligibility (page 4):
 1. We continue to excel in graduating those students who exhaust eligibility and follow through to graduation thanks in part to our fifth year aid program that provides tuition scholarships.

- 2015 Graduation Success Rate (page 5):
 1. 78 represents YSU's highest rate since the GSR was created in 2005.


BACKGROUND: The Board of Trustees has requested an annual report of our programs Academic Progress Rate (APR).

SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS:

- The minimum APR score permitted by the NCAA is 930.
- Men's Track, who previously fell below the 930 mark, has now exceeded the minimum.
- Although not a figure tacked by the NCAA our average Multi-Year APR rate of 972 is 10 points higher than last year and represents an all-time high.


BACKGROUND: The Board of Trustees has requested an annual report of our student-athletes grade point averages.

SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS:

- Our student-athletes concluded the Spring 2015 semester with one of the highest overall cumulative GPA in history at 3.10.
- 13 varsity teams had a *cumulative* team GPA over 3.00.
- 63% (206) of our SA's had a *semester* GPA of 3.00 or greater, which is an all-time high.
- 56% (183) of our SA's had a *cumulative* GPA of 3.00 or greater during the 2014-15 year.


