OFFICE OF ALUMNI ENGAGEMENT REPORT

June 2017

ALUMNI ENGAGEMENT OVERVIEW

As the Fourth Quarter of FY17 kicked off on April 1, 2017, Alumni Engagement outreach focused on Regional Alumni Groups, Affinity Groups and Service to Colleges. Highlights follow.

- From July 1, 2016 to April 30, 2017, the Office has engaged a total of 15,585 individuals through activities such as local and regional Alumni reunions and receptions, anniversary celebrations, tailgates, Watch Parties, Homecoming and Holiday Parades, and volunteer events. For the same period last year, Office activities reached 3,508 individuals. This increase reflects the FY17 focus on engagement versus the FY16 focus on Alumni Society membership. Note: Numbers for both years reflect contact with live people and do not include direct mail, email, or social media.
- The Office has increased the number of active Regional Alumni Groups from 8 to 18, up 125% over last Fiscal Year.
- Events scheduled within the Fourth Quarter alone, April 1 to June 30, 2017, represent a doubling of the number of events over the same quarter last year from 11 to 22 in FY17.
- Our on-going focus on digital engagement and social media continues to provide dramatic results. Alumni Engagement now has 3,174 Facebook followers, up 226 over last year, and its page is now engaging an average of 2,568 people per week, compared to 2,032 people per week last year a 26.4% increase. From July 1, 2016 to April 30, 2017, Alumni Engagement has increased its twitter followers from 361 to 547, a 51.5% increase.
- Our targeted in-person and online marketing resulted in dual increases of 230% for the number of Legacy Scholarship applications (from 12 to 40) and in Alumni Connect requests from recent graduates and alumni relocating for careers (from 10 to 33).
- The Office prepared 67 research reports for the quarter totaling 624,575 alumni and friends. Research conducted by Alumni Engagement supports events for academic departments and University programs as well as Alumni activities, e.g., the Office researched alumni in San Francisco for an event hosted by Provost Abraham during his scheduled travel. Alumni research has also supported International Program Office visits to China, Ghana and Thailand.
- Under the leadership of David Moore, Alumni Society Board President, and Maureen Drummond, Alumni Society President-elect, the Board is re-examining its role and focus and will hold a Board retreat in June.

Alumni Research

In the third Quarter, the office prepared 67 reports for various purposes, totaling 624,575 alumni and friends. A strategic effort has been initiated to capture employment data for our alumni, utilizing the Meltwater subscription service, including the Alumni Update Form link in all of the colleges, athletic newsletters, and the Magazine, as well as regional and local alumni event invitations. The increased promotion of the online Alumni Update Form is resulting in approximately 10 updates per day from various sources, with highest response rates immediately after the material is mailed or emailed. Significant research was conducted for the alumni regional networks as well as for affinity groups and 50th anniversaries for Physics (Planetarium), Geography and Nursing, and for the 65th Anniversary of Greek Sing.

Greek Sing Pre-Concert Alumni Reception: Alumni from all decades of graduation attended the reception on April 8 at Stambaugh Auditorium's Christman Memorial Hall. The event commemorated the 65th Anniversary of Greek Sing—1952 to 2017.





In attendance were sisters from the Phi Mu Sorority, which brought Greek Sing to Youngstown College in 1952. The gathering met its objective of engaging younger alumni: more than half of the attendees graduated between 2000 and 2016.



The Ward Beecher Planetarium celebrated its 50th Anniversary with a special Planetarium show and alumni dinner featuring Keynote Speaker Dr. Warren M. Young, Faculty Emeritus and Retired Planetarium Director. The evening was sold out with more than 100 guests. Physics alumni attended from all over the country, including Alaska, Georgia, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri and South Carolina.







Campus News of Note June 2017

Graduation numbers reach 34-year high

The number of students earning degrees from YSU this academic year is the second highest in the university's 100-plus year history. Just shy of the university's largest-ever class of 2,448 students in 1982-83, YSU graduated an anticipated 2,387 students during the 2016-17 academic year. This is only the third time since YSU's founding in 1908 that an academic year exceeded 2,300 graduates.

First class in new Master of Accountancy program

Eleven students received degrees as part of the first graduating class from the new Master's of Accountancy program during YSU's Spring Commencement ceremony Saturday, May 6.

Graduate earns NSF fellowship

Jenna Wise, who graduated during YSU's Spring Commencement, has been awarded a prestigious Graduate Research Fellowship from the National Science Foundation that will finance her PhD studies at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh starting this fall.

Prominent speakers captivate YSU community

An author, feminist organizer, entrepreneur and transportation innovator shared their stories with the YSU community during the successful university lecture series this spring. YSU's Paul J. & Marguerite J. Thomas Colloquium featured Veronika Scott, founder and CEO of The Empowerment Plan on March 21, while Robin Chase, a transportation entrepreneur and co-founder/former chief executive of Zipcar, lectured on April 3. On March 28, Gloria Steinem, writer, lecturer, political activist and feminist organizer, spoke to a sold-out crowd in Stambaugh Auditorium as part of the Centofanti Symposium. Margaret Atwood, winner of many international literary awards and author of more than 40 books of fiction, poetry and critical essays, presented YSU's Skeggs Lecture Series April 21.



Seeing stars for 50 years

YSU's Ward Beecher Planetarium commemorated 50 years of sharing the stars with a special show and dinner Saturday, March 18, as well as a new historical exhibit celebrating the facility's milestone year. The exhibit, left, in the David C. Sweet Exhibition Gallery on the fifth floor of Maag Library contains information about the opening of the planetarium in 1967, the different equipment that has been used in it, some of the special programs it has created, and the faculty and staff of the astronomy department. The display, which will be on exhibit through the end of 2017, also includes photographs, special effects equipment and video footage.

Studying music in Hungary

Students studying in the Dana School of Music will soon be able to study abroad in Hungary under an agreement signed between YSU and the University of Szeged, right. The agreement will also allow students from Szeged to study at YSU, helping to expand

the international exposure of students on campus as well.





Dana Chorale's historic trip to South Korea

For the first time in YSU history, an ensemble from Dana performed in Asia as YSU's Dana Chorale, left, under the direction of Hae-Jong Lee, embarked on a musical and educational tour in South Korea May 8 to 19. The group of 25 YSU students and four faculty members visited Seoul, Cheongju, Samcheok, Changwon and Busan, and performed at Sejong University, Chungbuk National University and Changwon National University.

Accelerated program saves YSU students a year of law study

YSU and the University of Akron School of Law have signed an agreement that will shorten the time to earn a law degree. YSU students will be able to get a bachelor's degree and a law degree in six years, rather than the traditional seven years, through an accelerated 3+3 program in which students will spend three years at YSU and three at Akron. Under the agreement, students can get a YSU bachelor's degree after their first year of law school by applying the courses in the first year of law school to undergraduate degree requirements.

Heritage Awards presented, Heritage Park dedicated

The late Joseph Edwards, an accomplished musician, long-time director of the Dana School of Music and former dean of the College of Fine and Performing Arts, and K.J. Satrum, retired executive director of Student Services and a champion for students for more than three decades, received the YSU Heritage Award in separate recognition dinners this spring. Both recipients, as well as the 73 other former faculty and staff members who have received the YSU Heritage Award, will have their names engraved on the wall at the new YSU Foundation Heritage Park. Located on Elm Street just north of Kilcawley Center, the park was dedicated May 10 and also celebrates the 50th anniversary of the YSU Foundation, which funded the \$100,000 project.



Equestrian team not horsing around


YSU's Equestrian Team finished the 2016-17 season as Reserve Champion – second in its region. Senior Sarah Newman ranked among the top 12 collegiate equestrians nationwide and qualified to compete in the National Intercollegiate Horse Show Association show in Lexington, Ky. Under the leadership of coach Amy Watkins, an American Quarter Horse Association judge and owner of Watkins Quarter Horses in Canfield, the team just finished its third season.

Cisco Academy returns to campus

Networking and information technology professionals, as well as YSU students, now have the opportunity to obtain certifications through the Cisco Academy on campus. Cisco Academy is an IT skills and career building program available to learning institutions and individuals worldwide.

Track & Field runs away with Horizon Championships

The YSU men's and women's indoor track and field teams, right, both claimed Horizon League Championships. The men broke school records in the 60m hurdles and heptathlon while the women set new standards in the 60m hurdles and pentathlon. All four marks occurred at the Horizon League Championships at the WATTS. It was the third Horizon League Indoor Track and Field Championship for the men, including their second consecutive title. For the women, it was their third title in four years and sixth Horizon crown overall.



The Payiavlas Family, owners of AVI Foodsystems in Warren, Ohio, donated \$500,000 to YSU. In recognition of the donation, YSU will name the classroom in the Don Constantini Multimedia Center at Stambaugh Stadium for the Payiavlas Family. The center will be constructed atop the east side of the stadium and include classroom space for YSU's Sports Broadcasting program.



Women's Tennis claims Horizon League, advances to NCAA

The YSU women's tennis team defeated Wright State 4-2 to take the Horizon League Championship. It marks the fourth straight Horizon League Championship for the Penguins who also advanced to the NCAA Regionals for the fourth time in as many years.

Men's basketball has new head coach

Jerrod Calhoun, who led Fairmont State University to the 2017 NCAA Division II National Championship game, is the 13th men's basketball head coach at YSU. Calhoun, a native of Cleveland, Ohio, spent the last five seasons as the head coach at Fairmont and accumulated an overall record of 124-38. He guided FSU to the NCAA Division II Tournament in each of the last three years and four times overall.



Police Chief named

Shawn Varso, a native of Youngstown, graduate of YSU and a 21-year veteran of the YSU Police Department, has been named chief of police. Varso has served as interim chief of the department for the past year.




WYSU-FM SPRING 2017 MEMBERSHIP DRIVE REPORT

WYSU-FM raised \$129,693 from 943 donors during its April 2017 "listener-friendly" campaign. It was the second highest spring total ever, raised in half the time of the week-long drives of past years. The average pledge was \$20 higher than normal, indicating increased support by our core audience, and perhaps a concern about the potential loss of WYSU's grant funding from CPB. Members were reached through mail, email, the website, social media, and short air spots without extensive program interruption.
