### RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT GIFT OF REAL ESTATE



### **Spring Commencement 2020 Update**

Location: Stambaugh Stadium

Youngstown State University's largest academic celebration, Spring Commencement, will be held in Stambaugh Stadium in 2020. The reason for this change of venue is to <u>safely</u> accommodate the growing number of graduates and their guests. Pride on full display.

The benefits of Stambaugh Stadium include:

- 17,000 seats for guests; no need to limit the number of guests
- More space for graduates on the field and in the robing rooms
- More handicap seating
- Access to the score board to show videos prior to the start, then to show the ceremony from beginning to end, including each graduate crossing the stage
- Concessions and more restrooms available to guests
- More room for Barnes and Noble to set up in the concourse
- Penguin pride and pomp and circumstance on full display! A complete celebration of YSU!!!!

The stage will be situated on the center 50-yard line and will face the West stands. The Platform Party will robe in a designated room inside the stadium and will process down a center aisle on the field and be seated on the stage. The ceremony will proceed as usual and will take place rain or shine. It will be canceled if there is a call for extreme weather. More details to follow.
