



Mandatory Compliance Training

Youngstown State University is committed to providing an educational and work environment that values all individuals and respects the dignity and rights of all members of the University community. It is the expectation of the University that all employee conduct will be guided by integrity, mutual respect, and civility.

In furtherance of these commitments, and in compliance with University policy, federal and state law, the University is providing training to all faculty and staff using the interactive online compliance training tool, EduRisk. The EduRisk Learning Portal is provided by United Educators and delivers complimentary resources to students, staff, and faculty of member institutions. United Educators is the country's leading provider of liability insurance for schools, colleges, and universities.

The following is a list of the Compliance Training courses that you are required to complete along with a brief description of the course.

Anti-Hazing: Recognize and Prevent Hazing - This course will teach you about the harms that hazing can cause and the typical, yet misguided, reasons people use to justify hazing. There are also some tips to help you determine if an activity is hazing, tell you how find your institution's policies about hazing, and give you some ideas about how to respond if you become aware of hazing (20 minutes).

Data Security Learning Program- This learning program includes online courses and supplemental resources to provide learners with a high-level overview of data security issues while offering practical steps institutions can take to avoid data breaches (50 minutes).

Courses within the Program include:

- Data Security: Malware (10 minutes)
- Data Security: Mobile Devices and Third-Party Websites (10 minutes)
- Data Security: Passwords (10 minutes)
- Data Security: Phishing (10 minutes)
- Data Security: Physical Security and Unintended Disclosures (10 minutes)

Mosaic: Learning Program for Higher Ed- Workplace harassment and discrimination diminish the entire campus community, as does the related problem of student sexual misconduct. College and university employees, including faculty and staff, have a vital role to play. This course will help employees identify, address, and prevent these problems with the Mosaic learning program.

Courses within the Program include:

- Mosaic: Prevent Discrimination and Harassment Together- Employees (40 minutes)
- Mosaic: Prevent Discrimination and Harassment Together- Supervisors (40 minutes)
- Mosaic: Prevent Sexual Violence Together (45 minutes)

Follow the instructions below to register and complete the required compliance trainings:

1. Go to <https://learn.ue.org>
2. Under the REGISTRATION section, enter the following information:
 - a. First Name, Last Name
 - b. YSU Email address
 - c. Learning Path- enter YSUNewEmployee or YSUNewSupervisor
 - d. Affiliation ID- enter FM6CL388010
 - e. Optional Field 1- enter your role as one of the following Faculty, Staff, Student, Contractor, Volunteer
 - f. Optional Field 2- enter your department name
 - g. Optional Field 3- enter your full YSU Banner Number
3. Click on the Register button
4. You will receive a welcome email with your username and a temporary password; follow the link in the email to sign on.
5. You will be prompted to enter your temporary password, create a new password, and create a security question.
6. Once you are logged in, be sure to complete all courses assigned to you.
7. You will receive an email containing a link to your completion certificate upon successful completion of the course. Your history of completed courses is found under the "My Completions" tab.
