A Brief Guide to STUDENT ACADEMIC GRIEVANCES

What is an academic grievance? An academic grievance meets one of the following criteria:

- ✓ Material deviation from the grading scale or weight distribution indicated on the course syllabus by the faculty member, to the detriment of the individual student or the entire class.
- ✓ Material deviation of faculty contractual obligations as specified in the article on Teaching Rights and Responsibilities in the Faculty Collective Bargaining Agreement, to the detriment of the individual student or the entire class.

What should I do if I believe I have an academic grievance?



TALK TO THE COURSE INSTRUCTOR Resolved? Process ends Unresolved? Go to next step.



TALK TO THE DEPARTMENT CHAIR Resolved? Process ends. Unresolved? Go to next step.





TALK TO THE COLLEGE DEAN Resolved? Process ends. Unresolved? Go to next step.





SUBMIT AN ACADEMIC GRIEVANCE FORM TO THE ASSOCIATE PROVOST Await decision if issue is grievable.

Not grievable? A letter is sent to you and the process ends here.

Grievable? Prepare for a hearing with Academic **Grievance Committee**
